Guidelines for Book Report #1

Paragraph One:

- 1. In a complete sentence, tell the title and author of the book.
- 2. Describe the main characters and where the story takes place.
- 3. Tell about what happened in the story including the important events at the beginning, the middle, and the end.

Paragraph Two:

- 1. Give your opinion of the book. Give specific examples from the book. Was it funny, interesting, exciting, etc.?
- 2. Would you recommend this story to a friend? Why or why not?

Guidelines for Book Report #2

Choose ONE of the following options. Please be sure to include the title, the author and which report you are completing.

1. Make my Book into a Movie!

Imagine that you are the author of the book you have just read. Suddenly the book becomes a best seller. Write a one page letter to a movie producer trying to get that person interested in making your book into a movie. Explain why the story, characters, conflicts, and resolution would make a good film. Suggest a filming location and actors to play the various roles.

2. Interview with the Main Character

Interview a character from your book. Write 7-10 questions that will give the character the opportunity to discuss his or her thoughts and feelings about his or her role in the story. Be descriptive. Write it in a play format so that I know who is speaking.





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3. Comic Book

Make 5-8 sketches of some of the scenes (in order) in the book. Give each picture a caption. You may also use speech or thought bubbles like a comic book. Be sure to draw your pictures neatly and use color! ©
